Genesis 37:5-11;  
Revelation 12:1-2

Just as Joseph's dreams revealed God's sovereign purpose, the imagery of the woman clothed with the sun reminds us that God orchestrates history according to His perfect plan. The same God who preserved Israel through centuries of opposition is faithful to complete His work in your life. What "signs" has God placed in your life to remind you of His faithfulness? Take time today to recognize His hand guiding your story toward redemption.

Reading:  
Romans 10:9-13;  
Revelation 12:10-11

"They have conquered him by the blood of the Lamb and by the word of their testimony." These words contain the secret to spiritual victory. Satan accuses us day and night, reminding us of every failure and sin. But we have a defense attorney—Jesus Christ—whose blood speaks louder than any accusation. Your victory isn't found in your performance, goodness, or religious activities. It's secured entirely by what Jesus accomplished on the cross. Today, speak your testimony aloud: "Jesus came to save sinners like me. I am forgiven. I am loved. I am saved." When doubts arise about your salvation, return to this truth: you're heaven-bound not because of what you've done, but because of what He has done. Let this reality transform how you face today's challenges.

Day 4: Our Identity in Christ

Reading:  
2 Corinthians 5:17-21;  
1 Peter 5:8-11

Satan operates through deception and accusation, trying to make you forget who you are in Christ. For unbelievers, he whispers that he doesn't exist. For believers, he shouts accusations about past failures. But God declares a different reality over you: you are a new creation, justified and righteous through Christ. The enemy may prowl like a roaring lion, but he's a counterfeit compared to the true Lion of Judah. You are joined to Christ—His nature dwells in your nature. The devil cannot handle the One to whom you are united. Stand firm in your identity today. You're not defined by your weaknesses but by whose you are. Speak truth over the lies: "I am redeemed. I am forgiven. I belong to Jesus."

Day 5: Protected by  
Divine Grace

Reading:  
Psalm 91;  
Revelation 12:13-17

Even in the fiercest persecution, God protects His own. The imagery of the woman given eagle's wings to escape the dragon's fury reminds us that God provides refuge in impossible circumstances. Satan's fury increases as his time grows short, but God's protective power remains constant. You may face spiritual attacks, trials that seem overwhelming, or circumstances that feel like floods threatening to sweep you away. Remember: the same God who will preserve Israel in the tribulation is preserving you today. He opens doors of escape, provides supernatural strength, and carries you on eagle's wings when you cannot walk. Whatever battle you face, you don't face it alone. Trust His protection, rest in His provision, and know that in the end, you win.
